COASTAL CLEAN-UP PROGRAMMES

Will the Minister of EARTH SCIENCES be pleased to state:

- (a) the number and details of Coastal clean-up programmes conducted by the Government so far; and
(b) the State/UT-wise details thereof along with the benefits of the same?

- (a) The total coastal clean-up programs conducted in the Indian Coastal Region so far is 300, since 2017. Out of which 236 beach clean-up events has been conducted by National Center for Coastal Research (NCCR) MoES. The remaining number of coastal clean-up activities has been conducted by (i) Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change (MoEF & CC) in collaboration with Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES) and as part of several existing Government initiatives such as Swachh Sagar Surakshit Sagar, Swachhata Pakhwada etc and (ii) National Institute of Oceanography (NIO), Goa as part of International Coastal Clean-up Day and World Oceans Day.
- (b) The state-wise/ UT-wise details are provided in the table below.
