A. THE PARTICIPANTS

Met Office, for and on behalf of the Secretary of State for the Defence of the United Kingdom and Northern Ireland whose principal place of business is at FitzRoy Road, Exeter, EX1 3PB, United Kingdom ("Met Office").

and

Ministry of Earth Sciences, Government of India, whose office is at Mahasagar Bhawan, CGO Complex, Lodhi Road, Delhi 110003, India ("MoES")

Singularly known as the Participant and collectively as the Participants.

B. INTRODUCTION

Whereas:

- (i) Both Participants have common interests in meteorology and related sciences and wish to co-operate in a manner that allows the exchange of scientific resources, personnel and technical knowledge on the basis of equality, reciprocity and mutual benefit, which supports the improvement or development of meteorological services for both Participants.
- (ii) The Met Office is the owner of a suite of software which can be used for numerical weather prediction and climate modelling.
- (iii) MoES has expressed a wish to obtain licences for the Software for the purposes set out in the licences at Part 2 of this Agreement.
- (iv) MoES has met the necessary qualifying criteria required for the granting of the Software licences under this Agreement.
